Now about 50% of the mailing list is students, middle and high school and college, and 25% are age 22 to 30, and we'll just leave ages unsaid for the last 25% since, well, they're old. Articles are on character, values, spiritual life, relationships and more ... and some fun.

The theology position is "conservative," i.e. Jesus is God's Son, eternal, part of the single triune God, born of a virgin, sinless, crucified and risen, and is the *only* way to eternal life. We are free to choose Him. He has told us to be holy and that includes behaviors such as: sex outside of marriage is wrong.

Our goal is mail in your mail box about 15 times a year. We're trying to say that <u>you</u> are <u>important enough</u> for us to put this in your mailbox. We care about you and want to encourage your character growth and your spiritual walk. We also distribute a daily email devotional.

Another part of the ministry is prayer. We pray for those on our mailing list as the mail is prepared. When you get mail from us, you know someone prayed for <u>you</u>.

July 3, 2008 It was for freedom we were freed.

Since the C&WC is read "internationally," Sweden, Kenya, Brazil, Australia, and Mozambique, I'll ask this question: In the U.S.A. the 4th of July is "Independence Day," a holiday, the date of the signing of the Declaration of Independence declaring our independence from England; does England have a "4th of July"? - - - - - - - Sure it does. There is a July 4th everywhere the Gregorian calendar is used. In the U.S.A. it's a special national holiday, that's all.

I was trying to think of things about the 4th of July and freedom for this issue. Then all I could think of was something I read with this passage in Galatians. (My paraphrase of Galatians 5:1-6):

It is for freedom that Christ set you free from rules and regulations and "the Law." If you let rules, like how often you attend church or how much you tithe, rule your life, you are a slave to the rules. If you are trying to be justified and aligned with God by obeying the rules, you have alienated yourself from Christ and removed yourself from His grace and forgiveness. The only thing that matters is faith expressing itself through love.

It isn't obeying the rules that aligns you with or makes you acceptable to God. That's backwards. It's when you decide to accept God's forgiveness – for whatever you've done, for everything you've ever done, for every thought of your mind and heart, for ignoring His offer of forgiveness – that you'll *want* to follow His rules.

Following God's "rules" can be viewed two ways. – There is the restriction of freedom view. We don't like rules because we want to do whatever we want to whenever we want to. Ravi Zacharias in his Fall 2000 issue of *Just Thinking*, wrote, "Just in case you think I am stretching a point, the truth slips out from the mind of the skeptic. Aldous Huxley acknowledged it when he wrote his book *Ends and Means*: "We objected to morality because it interfered with our sexual freedom."

A second view is: God's rules don't restrict me, they protect me from consequences. -- "But I want to experience the most possible ... I want to escape the limits others put around me ... I want to experience "the other life," a "more exciting, fun life." (It's part of the TGIG syndrome - 'the-grass-is-greener.' - "If the grass looks greener on the other side of the fence, you can bet their water bill is higher.") Some think that "rules" keep us from experiencing all we could. Stuart McAllister wrote for Slice Of Infinity, 11/27/01, "This desire to escape [staying within the rules] is also voiced by many searching for "peak" experiences, whether through skydiving or another sexual encounter. Consider, for example, the world of extreme sports: It beckons the participant to take serious risks, conquer danger and pain, and in doing so, find something that is missing in everyday existence. And yet I am reminded of what I have heard my colleague Ravi Zacharias say on occasion. Says Ravi: 'The loneliest moment in life is when you've just experienced the ultimate, and it's let you down.' Yes, we can go from peak experience to peak experience, but none last, and we are left longing for more." - So some try "extreme sports or activities. On TV *** continued on p.2 ***

The all survived, with varing injuries.

Illogical God

It occurred to me as I was cruising with my long time girlfriend (and the only non-familial lady I've ever kissed) that God is completely and utterly illogical. As I was informing Him of this, I realized that He is, in human terms, an idiot for being Who He is. Allow me to explain: any person who stays in an abusive, unloving relationship is considered a fool by their friends. "He doesn't love you." That's good enough reason for any girl to terminate a relationship (we won't go into the tainted view of "love," because it's irrelevant). "She manipulates you." Also good enough reason. But, not God. No, no... He holds His heart out, knowing full well that we are going to grab it, stab it, mutilate it and throw it in the dirt. Why does He do this? I have no idea. He's the illogical one, not me. So, how can a God who knows everything that is to come continue to allow Himself to be mistreated when He knows that mistreatment will persist? Love (so I lied earlier). It doesn't matter to Him that we don't love him. It doesn't matter that we wrong Him. All that matters to Him is that He loves us. There are no transactions with God... no more 'deals' like in the Old Testament... no signs and wonders... except that He loves us. Now, He chose to use us to love us... wait... what? God... perfect.... humans... not perfect... love is perfect... I see a disconnect here. And then again, maybe not. See, I was pondering as I drove along, with my arm stretched across the seat, that God doesn't have a body. I can't tuck Him into bed at night. I can't help Him use the bathroom (and then regale audiences with anecdotes following). I can't make Him chicken soup when He's sick and hold his hair out of the toilet as He vomits. I can't hold Him in my arms and let Him cry on me. So, then... if I cannot love God in these ways, then I must somehow be able to love Him, right? Why would God make people only He can love? I believe that I must show His love to other people. Because God doesn't need any of those things I listed. He's perfect, like I said before. No, no. People are imperfect, and therefore they need those things, and while God could provide all of that (and does at times), He has chosen us to love them. If God loves us completely selflessly, foolishly, ridiculously... shouldn't we then love others in the same manner?

6/29/08 - Rules, schmules. So what?

Sometimes people say things like, "The Bible and church stuff is just a bunch of 'don't do this' rules." – Well, some times it is. Yes, there are a bunch of "don't do this" rules. And there are a bunch of "do this" rules, too.

The "don't" rules, they are for our own protection. There are consequences to "breaking the rules." The Bible says, "no extramarital sex." That covers both before and after, simply sex is for IN marriage only. That's because there are harmful consequences – divorces rates increase, families broken, the harmful effects on children from divorce, the harmful effects of a 'dad' not in the home. Need I say more? And sex before marriage – there are diseases, some with life-long effects, some even fatal, pregnancy and the hard choices and consequences that brings, emotional effects now and for marriage later. Do they *always* happen? No. But often enough that even secular psychological studies confirm the effects. - And "safe sex"? I can show you the data published by Planned Parenthood saying over 15% pregnancy rate for teens using condoms for "safe" sex.

I won't say the attitude of defying rules and boundaries was the cause yesterday. I'll only say that there were literal warning signs, "danger, don't go here," and barriers, they climbed over two 6' fences, and the 17 year olds went anyway. Not accidentally, deliberately. And one died.

Yesterday Marie and I had the privilege of presenting two more teenagers with sexual-purity-promise-rings they requested. That's two more whose intent is to stay within God's rules.

AUSTELL, Ga. (June 28) - A teenager was decapitated by a roller coaster after he hopped a pair of fences and entered a restricted area Saturday at Six Flags Over Georgia, authorities said.

Six Flags officials are uncertain why the unidentified 17year-old from Columbia, S.C. scaled two six-foot fences and passed signs that said the restricted area was both offlimits and dangerous to visitors, spokeswoman Hela Sheth said in a news release.

[picture] A teenager was killed on Saturday when a Batman ride, shown above in 1997, struck him on the ground at Six Flags Over Georgia. Park officials say he was in a restricted area, possibly trying to retrieve a hat, when he was decapitated.

Get on your knee and ask.


The Lord will hear you calling.


It's not too hard a task.
