# Crimson & White? What's this?

It started with 37 college students. in 1998. Now, in the 23rd year of issues, less than 10% of the mailing list are "students" ages 14 to 24. About 40% are ... we'll just say "over 30" in the database, including several 80+ers. About 1/3 of our over ~900 print copies go into prisons in 24 states (9/1/20 count), a direction we never expected this to go. But "the spiritual life," and values are not age or marital status or gender or life situational specific, they are universal. -- Topics are character, values, spiritual life - "walk the walk, not just talk the talk" - relationships and more ... and some fun.

The theology position is "conservative," i.e. Jesus is God's only Son, eternal, born of a virgin, sinless, crucified, died, and risen, and is the *only* way to eternal life. We are free to choose Him. He has told us to be holy and that includes behaviors such as: sex outside of marriage is wrong. Jesus said it comes down to 'love God and love your neighbor' (Matthew 22:37-40).

If you base your trust for entrance into Heaven in Jesus, God's Son, and His death and resurrection on your behalf, then your crimson stains are made white as wool. Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life. There is no other way (John 14:6). If you admit that you can not reach God's standard, are repentant and sorry for your short fall (sin) and rebellion against Him and have asked Him to forgive you, then He has forgiven you. If you are truly repentant, then there will be evidence of that in your actions, your life. - - If the "religion police" were to arrest you, would you be turned loose for "lack of evidence"? Or would the evidence of your actions convict you of being a Christian?

You WILL BE and ARE a slave! But you can CHOOSE your master! CHOOSE God today. John 3:16 is true. Accept no substitute!

Yeah, there's been many a moment, many a day when I wished I could go back and re-do things...

And as I stood in yet another room in my house with a paintbrush in my hand, I realized something: Essentially, we're giving our house a total do-over. A complete overhaul from top to bottom. And no inch of wall space has escaped my paintbrush! (Well, at least it won't by the time I get done!)



Yet, while it's possible to give a house a total do-over with paint and a husband who loves to build things (thankfully!), it's a whole lot harder to make do-overs a reality in life, isn't it?

A couple more somewhat related examples... stirred from the phrase "our children watch you living like this." A child that everything he did had to be perfect. He'd even line up his trucks and cars against the baseboard ... in exact size order at night. - We would DELIBERATELY make a small mistake so he'd see us. Then we'd say, 'Opps. make a mistake. I'll just fix that.' - Children watch, learn, and copy... good <u>and bad patterns</u> that we live in front of them. Be careful what you teach them ... by your examples.

People watch you.

If you are seen, by other adults or children, doing ... whatever, 'good' or 'bad,' they learn that behavior or attitude is acceptable or right. - racist, violent, stealing, cheating, and also restoring, making things right, ... whatever. - - We know a situation where the neighbor would take the children out to a restaurant to teach them "restaurant behavior" because the parents never did.

If you are mom, dad, uncle, grandma, even a neighbor, or even a 'stranger,' you ARE being observed. And even if you don't think ANYone sees you .... YOU see yourself ... and God sees you.

What we do on some great occasion will probably depend on what we already are, and what we are will be the result of previous years of self-discipline.

#### The Lion and the Stream

C.S. Lewis, in one little episode from his book *The Silver chair* illustrates God's invitation and our resistance. Aslan, the lion is representative of Christ and Jill one of us.

This is the first time they meet. Listen:

When Jill stopped, she found she was dreadfully thirsty... She listened carefully and felt almost sure she heard the sound of running water. Jill...looked around her very carefully. There was no sign of the Lion; so she plucked up her courage to... look for that running water.

...[S]he came to an open glade and saw the stream, bright as glass... [A]lthough the sight of the water made her feel ten times thirstier than before, she didn't rush forward and drink. She stood still as if she had been turned into a stone, with her mouth wide open. And she had a very good reason: just this side of the stream lay the Lion...



"I'm dying of thirst," said Jill.

"Then drink," said the Lion.

"May I—could I—would you mind going away while I do?" said Jill.

The Lion answered this only by a look and a very low growl. And as Jill gazed at its motionless bulk, she realized that she might as well have asked the whole mountain to move aside for her convenience. The delicious rippling noise of the stream was driving her nearly frantic.

"Will you promise not to—do anything to me, if I do come?" said Jill.

"I make no promise," said the Lion.

Jill was so thirsty now that, without noticing it, she had come a step nearer.

"Do you eat girls?" she said.

"I have swallowed up girls and boys, women and men, kings and emperors, cities and realms," said the Lion.

"I daren't come and drink," said Jill.

"Then you will die of thirst," said the Lion.

"Oh dear!" said Jill, coming another step nearer. "I suppose I must go and look for another stream then."

"There is no other stream," said the Lion.

What a powerful illustration this is. We thirst for God. Christ invites us to come and be filled by Him. Yet, fearful of the risk we turn away from Him, still thirsty.

GK Chesterton said it well: Faith and love are apt to be spasmodic in the best of minds. Men and women live on the brink of mysteries and harmonies into which they never enter and with their hand on the doorlatch they die outside.
