THE KID WHO WILL NOT QUIT

We are each handicapped. What's your handicap? Too smart – and lack character? Someone said, "The world has enough smart people. What we need are more GOOD people." Or maybe it is physical – I don't run well any more since the aerobics class did a number on my knees. Or learning? Or whatever. We all have SOME kind of handicap. The BIGGER questions are how you handle deal with your handicap and how you deal with other people. I ran across articles about Ben.

What some athletes lack in ability, they make up for in heart. What some are missing in strength and skill, they compensate for in sheer determination. And sometimes it's the kids who have no chance of winning at all who most inspire their teammates, friends, and people who don't even know them.

Sports Illustrated writer Rick Reilly told of just such a young athlete—a high school junior named Ben Comen. He suffers from cerebral palsy, yet he's a member of the Hanna High School cross-country team and runs every race. The winner usually runs the 3.1 mile course in 16 minutes; it takes Ben 51 minutes.

Reilly equated his style of running to "a man whacking through an Amazon thicket." He trips on Twinkie size rocks. Falls on his face since he can't react fast enough to use his arms to break his fall of over liquorice size twigs and takes literally minutes to get back up on his uncooperative legs. But he gets back up, sometimes bloody, and keeps shuffling along until he reaches the finish line. When he gets near, half the student body runs out to pace him in. The rest of the team goes back to pace with him the last ten minutes. Everyone cheers!

Why does Ben do it? He explains, "I like to show people that you can either stop trying, or you can pick yourself up and keep going."

So how about you? Do you give up when it gets tough? Have you got what it takes to keep on going... in your classes, in doing what's right? in living a life of character? in living a pure life based on Christian values and Biblical principles? Or do you give up when it gets tough?

Origins

Your view of the world and how it works is directly related to your view of origins. Your view of origins will determine your world view. When it comes to origins, there are ONLY TWO alternatives: Either God created the heavens and the earth, or He didn't. (God Is In The Small Stuff and it all matters. Bruce Bickel & Stan Jantz. 1998. Genesis chapter 1 is foundational to the whole book. If the book starts out with a lie, none of the rest can be true trusted. But that's not the only reason to (just) believe it.

Some time ago I ran across a book by Henry Morris, *The Genesis Flood*. Fascinating reading if you're into "scientific stuff." Morris was a hydrologist and an atheist, a professor at Virginia Tech (I think). He set out to disprove the possibility of the flood in Genesis. The more he researched ... well, he became a believer and eventually started a group in California called the Center for Creation Research.

Have you ever considered the complexity of ... of anything? Has "science" ever created so much as a leaf?! A simple plant leaf? ... Simple leaf? The structure of the cambium layer under the bark draws water from the roots in the ground; the leaves combine sunlight and minerals and water and create food for the tree; feeds it back into the growth layer, the tree grows.

- Some scientists went to God and said, We don't need you, God. We can create life now." "Oh, yea?" "Yea. We'll show you. Let's have a contest to create a man from scratch." "Okay," God says. So the scientist reaches down and picks up a handful of dirt. "Oh, no," says God. "You have to make your own dirt."

How did God do it ... How long ago ... Don't get hung up on when or how, just accept a designer. It isn't reasonable to accept that a cake just accidently happened, or a watch, how absurd to accept that frogs and puppies and people "just happened." Have you ever thought of how the same people that will show you how an anomaly is rejected and not reproduced, will turn around and tell you that a partial organ was developed over tens of thousands of years rather than be rejected and eliminated, until it eventually became a functioning organ? Contradictory? Sure is. The only way it would work is fit functioned fully.

Plants need the CO_2 from the animals; animals need the plants to absorb the CO_2 and return O_2 to the ecosystem. It is a delicate balance. Plants without the animals ... for millions of years ... would consume the CO_2 and die off. - It's not "blind illogical faith. Creationism is better science.

We took a student with us to a S.G. concert a couple years ago; it was their first S.G. exposure; the seats we had were excellent - just in front of the stage and off to the side, elevated, an excellent view of the performers; however they were also directly in front of the speakers which were the size of semi-trailers hanging from the rafters, maybe 50 feet to our right; LOUD doesn't BEGIN to describe it; not a good concert experience; not good at all ... Anyway... How can I describe Michael? The only thing that comes to mind... Picture if you can Johnny Cash... You know, all in black, voice a little rough, and "sings two octaves below the song." Well Michael is "short," does a ballad style, more baritone, even tenor maybe... Can you picture a short tenor Johnny Cash?

Anyway, for whatever reason I pulled out his tapes and stuck it in the van. Two songs I really love... "Not For Sale" (Not For Sale, 1999) - ".... Listen to me--- This heart belongs to Jesus-Cause He saved my soul from hell; This heart belongs to Jesus; This heart is- Not for sale! ... I'm not for sale-- No way sir-I'm not for sale. If you're livin' for Jesus there'll come a day; The devil's gonna try to get you some way (It may be sex, drugs, a relationship, attention, fame, fortune, a guy, a girl, security, ...) He'll try you and tempt you with his lies straight from hell; Just say-- I belong to Jesus and devil--- I'm not for sale!! Not for sale! Not for sale! Not for sale!"

I am not for sale! I've been bought and paid for. I'm committed. More than just interested, I'm committed. I've taken steps beyond decision. I'm into the area of, ... like the Nisson commercials used to say, I'm "driven." - - That's because of, in the words of another of Michael's songs, "There's somebody in me but it ain't me. It's the King of Glory livin' in me. Sometimes I like to think it's me, but it ain't me. It's the lovely Jesus livin' in me."

Which brings me to a question or two - - Are you for sale? What would it take to buy you? Would attention from a guy/girl get you to give in on moral principles? Would you compromise principles for profit? Would you forfeit someone else's wellbeing to benefit yourself? What drives you? What is your inner motivation? Who do you serve? Who / what is inside you?

There is a direct relationship with the desire to know God and the struggle that follows.

.... Despite signs that things are improving, the reality of sexual temptation remains—and Christian young people are not inoculated against these pressures. Hearing their voices, in fact, suggests that their plight might be even more precarious than their non-Christian counterparts:

"I know the Bible says you can't have sex before marriage. But why can't you, if you're in love with the person? It doesn't feel wrong. — Kendra, 14

"My boyfriend and I don't want to mess around anymore. But how do we keep this commitment? I never realized how powerful passion can be." - Shari, 15

"Kids at school are pressuring me and my girlfriend to have sex. I want to wait until marriage, but I worry about how this makes me look." —Darryl, 17

"I feel cut off from God. I want to do what's right, but I can't seem to. Recently I had sex with a guy, thinking that it would bring us closer. I know now that was a mistake, and I feel totally ashamed." —Aimee, 16

A lot of Christian teens are having sex and suffering painful, sometimes devastating consequences. Meanwhile, those not having sex are thinking a lot about it, many of them wavering between fear and curiosity.

Parents, youth pastors, and other concerned adults might hope that the influence Michelle says she believes that it's better for teens to save sex until marriage, as of biblical principles on their young would help them withstand the onslaughts of peer pressure, physical longings, and conflicting signals from secular voices ("Don't have sex, but when you do, use a condom"), but the several teens who spoke candidly with *Christian Reader* reveal a far more complicated picture.

The battle to stay pure

At 17, John was a handsome and energetic high school senior with a charming smile and winning personality. Popular for his athletic prowess, he had learned that such recognition brought with it certain expectations.

"Of course, there was always a lot of pressure to have sex, from teammates and bad about it. But I don't know how to make that happen." other kids," he says. "I was a football player, you know. And the girls—they really come after you. But the Bible is clear. No sex till marriage."

Now 18 and studying business administration in college, John says the main thing that helps him maintain a biblical standard of purity is a steadfast emphasis on his objectives. "I haven't given into drugs, alcohol, or premarital sex because I see where indulging has taken a lot of my peers," he says. "You have to stay prayed up and know what you want out of life. You don't want to limit yourself. Having babies or getting AIDS is not on your route. If you're focused on your goals, peer pressure shouldn't faze you."

Asked about Christian friends who gave in and became sexually active, John answers knowingly. "It starts out as curiosity. They want to know what it feels like. I want to know, too. I really don't want to wait. But I don't want to pay the costs of not waiting, either."

And John isn't just talking about physical costs. "I've seen some Christian guys and girls who start having sex, and they change. They still go to church, but their spiritual lives become fake. When you are consistently doing wrong and know it, your spiritual life becomes empty and you get farther and farther from God," he says. "Sometimes you end up not really believing in anything ."

"A few of these freshman may have been part of a 'True Love Waits' campaign or had their parents give them a 'promise ring' along with the reminder not to sleep The Sex Lives of Christian Teens around until marriage," Duin continued, "but the other 90 percent hadn't heard much in the way of gripping reasons for staying chaste."

> If Christian parents, pastors, and youth leaders hope to help Christian teens avoid the tragic consequences of bad sexual choices, the adults must help teens discover those gripping reasons for waiting until marriage for sex.

> As Marilee Friedrich points out in her 2001 book Sex. Drugs, and Jesus: Teenagers Share How Christianity Affects Their Lives (WinePress), many young people who commit to abstinence until marriage do it with admirable deliberation. Clearly, many Christian teenagers have enough spiritual maturity to learn, with the help of adults, not only how to say no to premarital sex and other risky behaviors but perhaps more importantly, why to say no.

'I don't want to hurt God'

Michelle, a quiet, attractive 16-year-old, says she enjoys school, loves God and her church, but finds her youth group a little dull. Asked whether the group talked much about sexual issues, she replies, "We don't talk about it at all." She wishes that her youth leader would address some of her and her peers' real-life questions—"Maybe if we talked about some of the stuff that's going on with us, then it wouldn't be so boring."

Michelle says it's not peer pressure but curiosity that led her to lose her virginity at 15 to a boy she barely knew. "I wasn't really thinking about how God would see it. And I didn't really regret what I did until later, when I talked to my mom about it.

"I didn't intend to tell her," Michelle continues. "She asked me, and I didn't want to lie. But after we talked, I felt a lot closer to her."

the Bible directs, but she struggles now with her recommitment to purity. "And I have more questions about my faith now," she says. "I guess I need to study the Bible more."

Calvin, 18, is a college freshman and active in his church choir. He said that he experiences the most pressure to have sex from members of the opposite sex. "In high school, I decided to have sex, just to try it. I felt bad later, when I thought about what the Bible said. I've prayed, but I still don't feel forgiven."

He adds, "I want to have control over my sexual behavior and to not have to feel

Maia, 16, was raised in a Christian home and has an older sister who became an unwed mother at 17. "My parents were so angry and disappointed," she recalls. "My dad especially was so hurt.

"I think about sex, too," she says. "I'm curious, especially after what happened with my sister. But all I know is that what she did really damaged our family. And my parents are, like, watching me, all paranoid now. I don't want to hurt God or my parents the way my sister did, or even by having safe sex."

.... Kara Eckmann Powell, who coauthored the 2001 book Good Sex: A Whole-Person Approach to Teenage Sexuality & God (Zondervan), believes that one reason a lot of abstinence programs fail is because they have too narrow a focus, both in time and attention. ... "Too much of sex education in churches has focused on slogans and single commitments," Powell asserts. "While these are worthwhile, they aren't enough. An ongoing commitment needs to be reinforced throughout the year..."

[... and so the C&WC occasionally and regularly says it: Sex is not bad. God designed it to be in marriage, so it is BEST when done that way.]

It's Never too Late to "Ask for Directions."

It is never too late to ask for directions when you are putting something together. It is never too late to ask for the manual to properly run your DVD player. It is never too late to ask for directions when you are lost. It is never too late to ask God to pick you up, forgive you, and set you on the right pathway of following Jesus Way.

Bringing It Home:

- 1. Whatever in your life that is broken or lost Jesus is ready to walk with you and set things right. Start by admitting to God that you are lost.
- 2. Pray for God to provide you with the direction you need, so that you can get on the pathway that God intends for your life.
- 3. Trust in the directions God does give you.

Prayer: Lord God, I know that I should seek your guidance all the time and in everything – but I once again have set out on my own, thinking that I know better than you do. Forgive me. I am lost. I can't get out of this without you. Show me your way, Lord, and I will follow. Amen.
