We spend a fair amount of time on the road. My 6 year old van has 144,000 miles on it now. That's an average of 24,000 miles a year. And there's Marie's car, too. And a rental car here and there.

I've taken several pictures that might just turn into an "idea starter" - then I have so many, sometimes I can't FIND the one I want. Like today. This was my second choice.



Some of you may recognize this sign. Which is the right way to go?

It's sort of like Alice in Wonderland when she meets the Mad Hatter. Let's see if I can get the story right. - Alice is at a fork in the road and she says to the Mad Hatter, "Which way should I go?" And he asks her, "Where do you want to go?" "I don't quite know."

And he answers her, "Well then it doesn't matter which road you take." - Or something close to that conversation anyway.

When we travel this road, and we do often, occasionally we take the road to the left. That goes North and to destinations like Durham, NC and Washington, DC and, oh, on my "to do list" is Philadelphia. Usually we take the road to the right. That heads East and destinations like Raleigh, NC and Morehead City. - So which is the "right road"? Well, like the Mad Hatter asked Alice, "Where do you want to go?"

On a real road, hopefully, you have a destination in mind. You are headed to school in Raleigh, or home to New York, or Greensboro, or Detroit. The destination and a map help you pick the right choices that will get you to the desired destination. - More often than not, we choose East I-40 to Raleigh, pass Raleigh, take the exit for US-70 and run east to Morehead City to see Lauren and Gabriel. Oh, yes, and Matt and Jessica.

And on an Interstate highway, ... Have you ever missed your exit? If you aren't paying attention and pass the exit... well, it can be a looooong way to get to the next exit, turn around and come back to where you wanted to be.

Life has roads and destinations and a map, too. And the roads have intersections and "exits" where you have to make choices. As you drive down the "road" of life, the first thing is to know the destination, check the map, then pay attention to take the right turns, and you should get there.

Destinations. In life there are only two. Eventually we will all end up in Heaven or Hell, and I'm not referring to Hell, Michigan (there really is such a town). If you want to get to Heaven, get out the "map book," the Bible, and read Paul's letter to the Christians at Rome, Romans. (Romans 3:23,24; 5:8; 6:23; 10;9-10; Ephesians 2:8-9; 1John 1:9)

[Can you make the choice?] Pack Your Bags

"He who loves father or mother more than Me is not worthy of Me; and he who loves son or daughter more than Me is not worthy of Me. And he who does not take his cross and follow after Me is not worthy of Me. "He who has found his life will lose it, and he who has lost his life for My sake will find it." Matthew 10:37-39, NASB95)

Jim Denison served as a missionary in East Malaysia. While there he attended a small church. At one of the church's worship services, a teenage girl came forward to announce her decision to follow Christ and be baptized.

During the service, Denison noticed some worn-out luggage leaning against the wall of the church building. When he asked about it, he was told, "Her father said that if she was baptized as a Christian she could never go home again. So she brought her luggage." Raymond McHenry, Stories for the Soul (Hendrickson, 2001), p.48

Wow! Every time I hear a story like that it humbles me and impresses me. Not everyone who professes faith in Jesus and obeys him in baptism will find himself or herself in the same position as that young Malaysian girl. Many do, though, and you simply must be impressed and admire such faith and determination. It is not easy to make such a choice.

On the other hand, we may be not be looking at things correctly, and we may not be asking people to make a decision to follow Jesus Christ as clearly as we should. The truth is that family is not the only thing a person might need to "leave" when becoming a Christian.

If you are not a Christian, let me focus your attention on some things you might have to "leave." It may be necessary for you to leave your friends. You may be running with people who will sap your faith and destroy any semblance of godliness in your life. You might have to leave some habits of life behind. These habits are among the things that identify the sins for which you need forgiveness. You can't bring them with you into your new life in Christ. You must abandon them for new habits. You might have to leave a job or chosen profession behind. The reason for this is that the work you are doing might itself be ungodly and unchristian. God won't sanctify something that is innately wrong. You might have to leave your entertainment behind. The fact is that much entertainment is sensual, and filled with encouragement to participate in, or gain pleasure from, things that are sinful. Take a good look. There may be much to leave.

The truth is a lot of people need to think about packing their "bags." Baptism is part of the dividing line between the old man marked by sin, and the new man marked by righteousness. In baptism we are buried into the death of Jesus, then we rise to walk in newness of life (Rom 6). When you choose to follow Jesus, you must also choose not to continue in the same old life. Pack your bags. God will take you on a life-changing journey. Don't plan on returning.

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In this Slice of Infinity, he refers to the Song of Songs by Solomon. Song of Songs is often pretty hot stuff, if you get what I mean. When the museum collection tour came through not far from here, we went to see part of the history of the Bible. It was really cool stuff. It was just before Valentine's Day and I bought a single page from a certified pre 1650 copy of a King James Bible, over 350 years old. The page I bought for Marie contains Song of Songs, Chapter 6 verse 3: "I am my beloved's, and my beloved is mine." -- True love requires a decision, a choice, to make a commitment.

A Deathless Seal

If musicians are the popular philosophers of our time, as many have observed, perhaps they are also our psychologists. The message of the musicians is hopelessness, confusion, and cynicism. The diagnosis is similar.

G.K. Chesterton once noted that people who are in love have a natural inclination to bind themselves by promises. One only has to listen to a few love songs to see this truth in human nature; we find a constant flow of promising and vowing. Yet we also find countless melodies reveling in casual love and promiscuity. But isn't this natural instinct to bind oneself with promises remarkably incongruous with a world dancing to the philosophy of boundlessness in the pursuit of pleasure?

The diagnosis for love is understandably a message of confusion. The boundless pursuit of pleasure bombards the senses in every direction, while the natural desire to find a love worthy of promise remains a contradictory cry of the heart. The idea of true love is met with cynicism—a concept left for Hollywood.

The Song of Songs is the book of the Bible that speaks most explicitly about human love, with words far-reaching into the heart and heartache of this current day. In one powerful verse the bride declares to her bridegroom: "Set me as a seal upon your arm, as a seal upon your heart. For love is as strong as death; its passion as fierce as the grave" (Song of Songs 8:6).

Love and passion impel us to place that seal upon our hearts, to bind ourselves to one another. The sheer fierceness of its nature calls for careful boundaries. Yet this is not a verdict meant to be followed simply because it is a good thing to do, a moral virtue we ought to follow. Like Christianity itself, it is good because it is first true: Love is as strong as death. Like all of the deepest questions of life, love is something to be reckoned with. As Ravi Zacharias notes, when you honor the sanctity of love, the person is exalted and pleasure ensues. But when you seek pleasure for its own sake, it is the person you profane and weariness that ensues. Promiscuity empties pleasure of the meaning for which it was created. There is more to life than pleasure itself; there must be a context for it.

The cry of the human heart for love will not fall silent until it has found that for which it ultimately searches. In the same place where the lingering questions of the meaning of life and the fierceness of the grave are answered coherently, sanctity in love is exemplified and found fulfilling. The remedy is comprehensive.

In his love and by his death, Jesus Christ seeks to bind himself eternally to your heart. At this inexplicable truth, the heartfelt response of the hymnist comes to mind:

O to Grace, how great a debtor, daily I'm constrained to be! Let Thy goodness, like a fetter, bind my wand'ring heart to Thee. Prone to wander Lord, I feel itprone to leave the God I love. Here's my heart, O take and seal it, Seal it for Thy courts above.

May this be the vow that guides our hearts to love well.

As I was updating the database, I noticed that there were FORTY students that I count as college Seniors and 12 HS Seniors. That is 52 students that are potentially changing addresses, 40 NOW and 12 in August. Only TWO have sent me updates.

I have started deleting rather than begging. It will probably be a sticker on the C&WC by your address. If I don't hear from you, I can only assume that you aren't getting the mail or aren't noticing the stickers or aren't reading it. When I mailed the last issue I also sent 12 postcards saying "You have been

from the C&WC mailing list." This issue I will be sending out 7 more DELETED post cards. We spend over \$5 on average with every issue for return postage and follow-up mail. That times 18 issues amounts to over \$90 a year getting the right addresses. Help us by emailing your new address when you know you're about to change an adress, or maybe you just don't want to get the C&WC anymore.

To step out of my comfort zone into the realm of the unknown where Jesus is and He's holding out His hand. 
